The Speaker recognized the presence of the guests sitting in the House who were SDS Army II, SDS Chinese, SDS Army VI, Research Fellow Military, and members of the Organizing Control team.

VI. MOTION: The House to debate and accept the Motion for the adoption of the Strategic Vision of the Government of Ruekehi.

Following this motion, the Prime Minister from the majority (Government in Office) presented the speech on the strategic vision of his political party, followed by the opinions of the official opposition presented by the shadow prime minister. The Speaker asked members to accept or reject the agreed strategic vision, and according to the voting procedure, the Ayes were the majority, so the motion was accepted and passed by the House.

strategy and it was noted by voices that majority were against the Strategy. The Speaker

guided the house to vote by raising hands, whereby 11 voted for and 12 voted against the

bill. The speaker further guided that a committee will be formed to harmonize the

government and the shadow government's submissions.

Army VI.
